The First Lesson

Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel!

Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem!

The Second Lesson


Philippians 4:4-7

The Holy Gospel

Luke 3:7-18

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."


And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages."

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

Renewal of Baptismal Vows

Bishop-

Jordan; people of Trinity, in Holy Baptism we received full adoption through God's grace and full empowerment for ministry through the Holy Spirit. Will you work together as partners in the mission of the Church, to reconcile all people to God through Christ?

We will, with God's help.

The water of baptism signifies our eternal covenant with God. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, in joyful obedience to Christ, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The Bishop blesses the water-

We pray you, O God, sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that all who in baptism are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

Rector-

Let us renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we renounce Satan and all his works, and promise to serve God faithfully in God's holy Catholic Church.

Rector	Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?
People	I do.
Rector	Do you believe in God the Father?
People	I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
Rector	Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
People	I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
Rector	Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
People	I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.		
Rector	Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?	
People	I will, with God's help.	
Rector	Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?	
People	I will, with God's help.	
Rector	Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?	
People	I will, with God's help.	
Rector	Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?	
People	I will, with God's help.	
Rector	Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?	
People	I will, with God's help.	

Rector-

May Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, keep us in eternal life by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen.**

The Bishop and Rector will now sprinkle the people with holy water, a reminder of our baptism and the grace we have received. As the water is sprinkled, you may choose to make a sign of the cross or simply receive this blessing with gratitude.

The Prayers of the People

Lector-

Jordan, with this prayer book we offer our prayers, intercessions and thanksgivings to God.

Rector-

Amen. In the Spirit of God, who searches the heart and knows our deepest needs, let us pray for the Church, the world, and all who yearn for Christ's healing.

In the hushed anticipation of your coming, O Lord, remind us that you are always with us, that like Joseph we might always be eager to fulfill your will, and be eager to pray:

O God, in days to come the mountain of your house will be established, and your joy shall reign. We especially pray for the church of the Holy Nativity in Kinnear and for the Anglican Church of Tanzania, that you might teach us your ways and that we might walk in your paths. Come Lord Jesus, **and hear our prayer**.

Out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and you, O God, shall judge between the nations. We pray for our nation, and all nations, that your peace would be manifest in every corner of the earth. Come Lord Jesus, **and hear our prayer**.

In your Kingdom, O Lord, wolves lie down with lambs and children play with serpents without fear. We pray for the sick, the suffering, and those in distress of any kind especially Joanne, Hilda, Mary, the Adams Family, Anthony, Whitney, Cal, Baby Vasquez, Barbara, Larry, and Diane that you would heal all injuries, comfort all grief, and settle all wrongs. Come Lord Jesus, **and hear our prayer**.

In the fullness of time, O God, you sent your son, to be born of our sister Mary. And his name was Emmanuel: God With Us. We thank you for your Presence with us, and we pray that you might be always present with those whom we love but see no longer. Come Lord Jesus, **and hear our prayer**.

Let us now offer our prayers for our own needs and those of others either silently or aloud.

O Christ, hear our prayers, restore us, and show us the glorious light of your countenance, that we might be saved. Come Lord Jesus. Amen.

The Great Thanksgiving



Gathering God, as grain is collected from the fields, in your Son you draw us to yourself; and as that grain is drawn together, in this holy meal you make us one.

Send your Holy Spirit upon your church to make us your harvest of righteousness. Sanctify this bread and cup that they may be for us the body and blood of Christ our Lord; who, at supper with his disciples, took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup. Again he gave you thanks, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Great is the mystery of faith.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Holy One of Israel, you are the great one in our midst. Come and dwell among those who long to know you amid toil and strife. Where your loved ones have been exiled by judgments against them, remove every fear from their hearts and give them hope. Where your sons and daughters

face the threat of enemies, show them how best to love their persecutors. Where oppression has turned your children into outcasts, gather them in your arms and carry them home. Bring us to that day when shame turns to praise and all creation resounds with rejoicing in your midst, Holy One, eternal Trinity, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
