WE ARE DELIGHTED TO HAVE YOU JOIN US AS WE ENTER THIS SEASON OF PREPARATION KNOWN AS ADVENT.

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin *adventus*, meaning "coming" or "arrival." In ancient Rome, *adventus* was a festival celebrating an emperor's return to the city after a military campaign. Within the Christian tradition, Advent marks the time of preparation before Christmas, the celebration of Jesus Christ's arrival on Earth. It is a season filled with anticipation, hope, and preparation.

But Advent is more than just outward preparation—like decorating, gift-giving, or baking (though these are lovely traditions). It's a time to prepare inwardly. Advent invites us to ready our hearts and minds for the coming of Christ.

During this season, we light candles and pray. We take time to reflect on ourselves—not only on our strengths but also on the places where we feel empty or broken. In these moments, we long for the healing and hope that God offers through Christ Jesus. As we look inward, we also look outward. We celebrate the goodness and joy around us while recognizing the pain and need in the world. We pray that Christ will work through us, bringing healing, hope, and liberation to those in need.

We welcome you to this service and this sacred season of Advent. Before the service begins, we invite you to take a moment to pray and reflect quietly. During the service, feel free to participate in ways that resonate with you—whether that means sitting, standing, kneeling, or simply observing. Some may bow or make the sign of the cross; these practices are optional and personal. Our hope is that you feel encouraged to connect with your spirituality in your own meaningful way.

The Holy Gospel

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus said, "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

"Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."

The Sermon

The Nicene Creed

Let us affirm our faith by saying together the historic words of the Nicene Creed.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Prayers of the People

In the hushed anticipation of your coming, O Lord, remind us that you are always with us, that like Joseph we might always be eager to fulfill your will, and be eager to pray:

O God, in days to come the mountain of your house will be established, and your joy shall reign. We pray for the church, especially All Saint's in Torrington and Province of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan, that you might teach us your ways and that we might walk in your paths. Come Lord Jesus, **hear our prayer**.

Out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and you, O God, shall judge between the nations. We pray for our nation, and all nations, that your peace would be manifest in every corner of the earth. Come Lord Jesus, **hear our prayer**.

In your Kingdom, O Lord, wolves lie down with lambs and children play with serpents without fear. We pray for the sick, the suffering, and those in distress of any kind, especially Joanne, Larry, Mary, the Adams Family, Helen, Anthony, Whitney, and Merilyn; that you would heal all injuries, comfort all grief, and settle all wrongs.

Come Lord Jesus, hear our prayer.

In the fullness of time, O God, you sent your son, to be born of our sister Mary. And his name was Emmanuel: God With Us. We thank you for your Presence with us, and we pray that you might be always present with those whom we love but see no longer. Come Lord Jesus, **hear our prayer**.

Let us now offer our prayers for our own needs and those of others, especially Joanne, Larry, Mary, the Adams Family, Helen, Anthony, Merilyn, Whitney, Cal, and those we now name, either silently or aloud.

Officiant

O Christ, hear our prayers, restore us, and show us the glorious light of your countenance, that we might be saved. Come Lord Jesus. Amen.

The Confession

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**



Send your Holy Spirit upon your church: strengthen our hearts in all holiness that we may be heralds of your kingdom. By your same Spirit, sanctify this bread and this cup, that they may be for us the body and blood of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord;

who, at supper with his disciples, took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup. Again he gave you thanks, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Great is the mystery of faith. Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

God of power, you have promised to make your way to us: come quickly to those who wait for you. Raise up every head that is bent low in sin. Lift up every heart that is bowed down in

shame. Uphold every soul that is made heavy by oppression. Inspire every weary throat to sing of the day when justice and mercy meet.

Bring us through all that is passing away to the life that shall never pass away, when every eye shall be lifted up to gaze upon your Son in everlasting glory with all your saints, and when the redemption for which we have longed shall forever be ours, in the company of your Son and the power of your Spirit, holy Father, blessed Trinity. **Amen.**

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
